Revd Janice writes: With the provision of Sabbath Sustenance coming to an end next week with the Pentecost edition, I have been asked to explain how it started and how I choose elements within it.

When we first entered Lockdown at the end of March 2020, Joy and I were considering how best to keep people connected and spiritually fed whilst we were physically separated. Initially I was going to put together the set readings for the day and a few prayers but, like Topsy, it grew! The name came about after Mavis asked for the sheets to be called something other than "Readings for . . . " We threw a few ideas around and Sabbath Sustenance was born; I rather like alliteration!

It seemed a good idea to have a picture associated with, or connected to, one of the readings or the theme as an illustration; sometimes a picture is worth more than words. There are times when I already have an idea of what I'm looking for when I enter the reading reference into my search engine; magically, various art work, photos, cartoons and graphics appear. Some weeks it is harder to find a suitable illustration than others but it is amazing what one can find!

During such strange times it has been both a discipline and a joy to draw Sabbath Sustenance together week by week; a regularly repeated refrain at a time when life was so very different, uncertain, unsafe and unsure which anchored me and, I hope, you. I was delighted that our two guest editors, Pam and Margaret, took on their weeks with

enthusiasm enabling me to have an occasional break – and the readership to experience a different 'voice'.

Similarly, the development of including the intercessions compiled by our faithful band of intercessors also introduced another element. I always hear the writer's voice as I read them, and am grateful that they cheerfully compiled them far in advance of usual for 'their' Sunday so they would be ready by the Wednesday each week.

I must also thank Mandy in the church office and Robin without whom the hard copies would never have been delivered, and Mavis and Paul T for ensuring the electronic and website copies were circulated. Thank you, everyone, it's been a real team effort and wouldn't have been the same without you.
