- **4) COVID IN INDIA APPEAL** We have had an email from Sister Hilaria at the hospital in India. She writes:
- Here in India we are facing the surge of covid 2nd wave. The situation seems to be devastating and scary as the pandemic is gripping many smaller cities, towns and villages where the damage is under-reported. As much as possible we help our rural people in the villages to follow covid safety protocol and comply with covidappropriate behaviour.

However, pain, loss and death are the terminology we keep hearing these days. We are forced to respond to the ailing population especially the women and children. At the moment, the intervention is needed at two levels:

One is nutritional support and another is medical supplements. We need your support! We count on your generosity!

It is a grim picture. They need our prayers and support.

We have, so far, raised £750 including Gift Aid. We are supporting Leonard Hospital in south India, through our contacts with the Miriam Dean Fund.
