WHAT YOU CAN EXPECT IN CHURCH THIS SUNDAY from Joy

"Dear St Mary's Church Family

In the light of the lifting of Covid restrictions on Monday and the guidance issued by the government and the Church of England, I want to update you on what this means for services at St Mary's from this Sunday.

We have spent some time as Clergy, Wardens and PCC working out what is the most responsible approach for our services in these initial weeks over the summer. We do not want anyone to feel unsafe at St Mary's or to consider that the lifting of restrictions means that they need to stay away.

Our initial guidelines are as follows, you will see that most of our protective measures remain in place:

 \cdot We will ask you to continue to wear your mask on arrival and during the service. The government is still expecting and recommending that they should continue to be worn in enclosed settings to protect ourselves, and take care of each other.

 \cdot We will continue to have hand sanitiser available.

 \cdot While there is no legal requirement to hold your details for track and trace purposes, we will continue to ask you for them. Again, this is something the government is still recommending.

 \cdot We will continue to use every other pew and you will be guided in as you are now - with those who are happy to, sharing a pew. This has slowly become more relaxed in recent weeks and can continue to be so.

 \cdot We will introduce singing with masks on, but initially this will be limited to one hymn at the beginning of the service, with another hymn outside at the end of the service (weather permitting). If you are happy to sing, please sit in the front half of the church.

 \cdot Communion will continue to be bread only and served in pews just to limit the movement around the building and sharing the peace will still be 'virtual'!

 \cdot We have decided that it is a little too soon to introduce refreshments after the service.

 \cdot We will continue to use the one-way system to leave church to conclude the service outside, but there will be less stewarding around this – please leave, being mindful of distance between you and others.

 \cdot As it is the summer, we will keep the inner south doors open during the service to increase the ventilation.

I am aware that for some this might seem too cautious. There is a disappointment about it and we long for the day when masks are removed and we can sing more freely. We have been very mindful of the rising infection rates and our responsibility to care for each other at this time. We need St Mary's to be a safe place for everyone to worship.

These have not been easy decisions this week and so it is important to say that these are initial guidelines for the next few weeks. We will review them, and so please do give us any feedback – do email or speak to clergy or other service leaders."
