a) We now know that the annual Remembrance Sunday ceremony at the War Memorial in Speen at 9am this Sunday will be a **small private ceremony only**, with wreathlaying by St Mary's Church and the Parish Council.

- c) There will also be a number of wooden crosses in a box at the War Memorial. They will be left there for a few days after Sunday's ceremony so, if you would like to, while on your daily exercise, please place a cross in the grass and take time to remember

d) Watch, listen and remember at home for this year's Remembrance Sunday.

A small, restricted service and wreath laying ceremony will be taking place at the Newbury War Memorial, where the public will be able to watch, listen and remember from their own homes.
