Dear Saints of St Mary's,

'Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.' Romans 12:12

This short verse was one which came to me at the point that this most recent lockdown was announced. I have to say that coming when it did, this lockdown took me a little by surprise. I think I thought of this verse because of the fact that the word 'hope' is in it. We all need a bit of hope right now and this verse talks about being joyful in hope. Hope and joy are such positive words. In general use, we use the word 'hope' to talk about something that we wish to happen, but without any real certainty that it will. In the Bible, our hope has certainty about it, because it is based on what has already happened, the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ – and the fact that he is coming again one day to sort out this troubled world, to renew creation and for us to be with him forever.

And then there is patience in affliction. 2020 has been a year of affliction, and just when we thought life had returned to some kind of normal, lockdown no. 2 was upon us. We all have to be patient once more – patient to wait for it to lift, patient with the restrictions on our lives and patient about not knowing yet what we can plan for Christmas, both at home and at church.
