2) IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM REV JOY MAWDESLEY RE OPENING

We are very pleased that St M's is open this Sunday 28th from 10.30-11.30 for private prayer. You are most welcome to come and join us in church for some or all of that time. Janice's usual Sunday resources will be available for your use.

Things will be a little different though in order to ensure that church is a safe place for all:

- Please sanitise your hands on arrival and departure using the hand sanitiser available.
- If you are happier with a face covering, please do bring your own, although there are some available at church.
- Under the present requirements, there needs to be a distance of 2m between people. Some pews are cordoned off in order to ensure that this happens. Please share the pew with people from your own household.
- We have put a one way system in place around church to ensure a flow through the building.

The current guidelines (both church and government) are that if you are in the clinically extremely vulnerable group and are still shielding, then you should remain at home. If you are in a vulnerable group (which includes the healthy over 70s) the advice is that you stay at

home as much as possible, but that if you do go out, you minimise contact with those outside your household and, of course, part of this is to observe social distancing. We would love people to join us at St Mary's on Sunday, but please only come if you feel confident in this decision.

..... we're also glad that we shall be opening the church on Wednesdays from 2-4, beginning on Wednesday 1st July. Thanks to those who have already volunteered. Pam will be coordinating this and will be in touch with the volunteers to sort out a rota and to give you any necessary info. If you need to contact her, her no is 01635 864274.

You will be aware that the government have now said that churches can hold services from Sunday 5th July. Further Church of England guidance is still awaited on this and we have yet to decide how soon we will hold our first service here at St Mary's. So watch this space!
